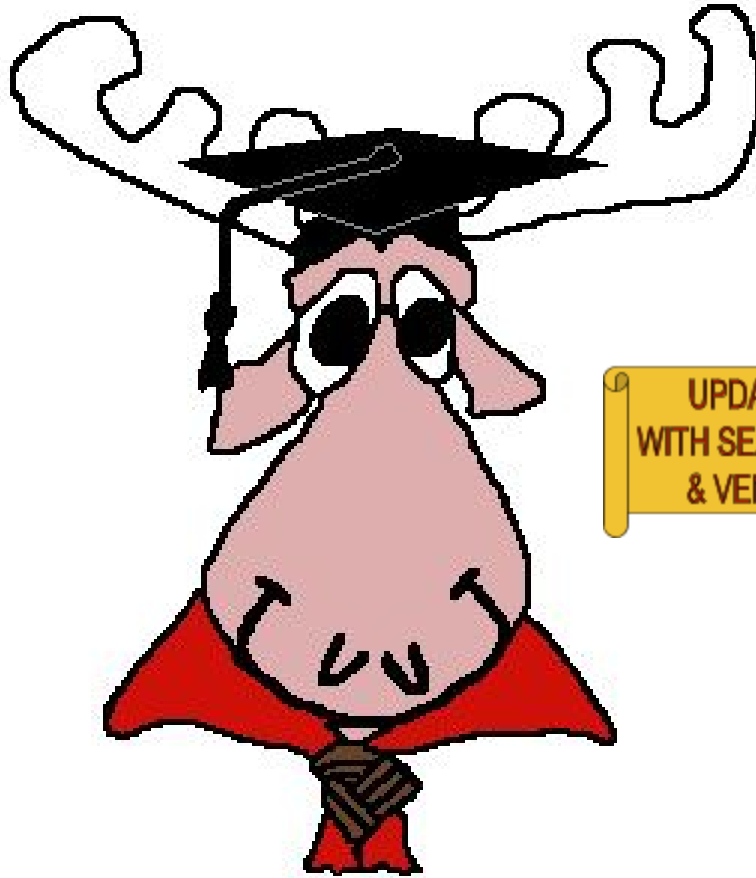

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### Real World Solutions to Common Troop Problems

BS01 Period 1

Most Boy Scout troops share similar challenges at one point or another. Veteran Scouters will offer tips and techniques that you can take to your troop and use immediately on topics such as recruitment, parent involvement, keeping the program fresh, youth-led and adult guided program, and how to overcome the challenges of running a troop.

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### Teambuilding 101

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### Menu Planning and Cooking Methods

The meals you eat while on an outing are a critical part of a successful trip. With the right planning, your meals should be well balanced, cooked properly and delicious. Topics include menu planning, food handling and storage, and cooking methods. Hamburger in an orange? Steak on a rock? Omelets in a bag? Come learn new and different ideas.
